Sisters and Brothers,

The Board of Trustees of the IBEW Local 347 Health and Welfare Fund would like to remind you that the annual dependent verification process is underway. It is very important as a plan participant that you take a few minutes to address this when you receive the letter from the plan administrator. It is a very simple process. If there are no changes in your listed dependents, you need only answer a couple of quick questions, sign and date the form then return it to the fund office. You may also bring it to the Hall, we can get it there for you. If you did experience a change in your listed dependents, you will need to fill out a new dependent enrollment form which was also included.

This year we have added an additional feature so that you may complete the dependent verification online.

- 1. Go to <a href="www.ibewlu347.org">www.ibewlu347.org</a>. Click on the "members" tab. Click on "benefits". This will take you to the benefits home page.
- 2. On the home page you will see a box that asks you to click "here" to access the dependent verification. Once there click "continue", then click "accept" terms.
- 3. Input your member ID # from your UHC card and then enter your date of birth and zip code using this format: YYYYMMDDZZZZZ.
- 4. Review your listed dependents, if it is correct, click "I agree". You will see a confirmation that states your data has been saved successfully. You are done. It only take a few minutes.

Also, if you haven't done so already, familiarize yourself and your spouse with the new telehealth benefit, Doctor on Demand. It is a face to face visit with a physician that will save you the hassle of a trip to a doctor's office or waiting in line. They can diagnose and prescribe medication for a variety of illnesses which you will find listed on the app. It is also provided to you with a zero copay.

I would also like to remind all our participants that our plan does have mental health benefits as well. If you seek assistance with personal and private mental health issues, you need to know that you are not alone. You can seek in network care by contacting UHC or if you are in need of timely assistance and cannot wait for a scheduled in person visit, another option is through the Doctor on Demand feature. They also have licensed professionals available to us through the app.

Congratulations to the 2018 St. Patrick's Day apprentice float design contest winners Kayla White, Brian Moss and Kenneth Templeton. The "team" will receive funds to apply towards their design/construction and each will receive a \$500 prize upon completion of their required assignments. We look forward to pulling the finished design through the parade this year. It's sure to be a great time.

## **Apprenticeship News**

**Code Corner -** Recently, I was asked about what the *NEC* requires for color coding conductors. The *NEC* does not specify color schemes for phase conductors, however, *Code* does indicate how we are to designate the grounded conductors, grounding conductors and high leg situations. Although the *Code* doesn't tell us how to color code our phasing, it does require us to post our identification means at the point of conductor origin. The following areas provide guidance for us when identifying conductors: Section 110.15 *High Leg Marking* 

Article 200 Use and Identification of Grounded Conductors.

Section 210.5 Identification for Branch Circuits

Section 215.12 Identification for Feeders

Section 250.119 *Identification of Equipment Grounding Conductors*

# Political Corner

Greetings one and all. I hope all of you are in good health! Well as we speak the Iowa Legislature is in session. They just finished their first funnel week. That is where they weed out what bills they don't want to pass and which ones they do. It originates in a sub-committee then it moves to full committee and then it moves to the floor for a full vote. If they do not pass the committee they drop it for this session. This doesn't include bills on taxes and spending. That is a good thing too, because right now they are trying to figure out how we are going to pay our bills. One way they are trying is to cut funding to the schools. This years funding has been determined that a 1% increase is all that is needed. Hmm I wonder if our members would be happy with that pay raise this year? Just a thought. Anyway, at the same time a small group of geniuses in a sub committee decided now would be a perfect time to introduce a bill that would enable private schools to get vouchers. Let's see public dollars going to private schools. That kind of makes it not private right? Maybe, I am just confused.

If any of you have ever collected unemployment don't worry they haven't forgotten about you. They are making it easier for the employers to deny unemployment benefits by changing the language. They want to change misconduct to disobeying an order or instruction. If the order is unsafe or unethical it doesn't state. If they want you to rat something up, and you don't do it and they get your money well too bad for you. It also allows disqualification of benefits if you say anything defamatory to the contractor. I don't even want to guess how many Wiremen that would disqualify. It's Senate File 2110 you may interpret it for yourself.

So ask yourself this question does it seem fiscally sound to further cut taxes when we cannot afford to pay our current bills?
