For participants of the LU 347 Health Plan, I would like to remind you of the new telehealth benefit that is available to you, Doctor on Demand. Once you have the App downloaded you will have 24/7 access to doctors right from the comfort of your home at no cost to you. DOD will treat and prescribe medications for things like allergies, colds, flu, sports injuries, skin rashes, UTI's, depression and anxiety, etc. It can also be used to refill existing prescriptions in a pinch.

The intent of this new benefit is to cut back on unnecessary visits to the doctor's office and the ER, saving the plan money in an effort to lower our premiums. This service will be very convenient for those that wake up in the middle of the night feeling ill simply needing a prescription filled. Search for Doctor on Demand in the App Store, it is represented with dr+ (in a blue square) and familiarize yourself and your spouse with the services provided.

Participants of the Local 347 Retirement and 401k have an additional benefit available. Through Principal and ARAG, we are able to offer estate planning services that include Wills, Living Wills, Healthcare Power of Attorney, Durable Power of Attorney, etc. Type <u>principal.com/willprep</u> or <u>www.aragwills.com/principal</u> into your address bar (not the search bar) and it will take you directly to ARAG's website.
