Sisters and Brothers,

We are still very cautious in our approach to reconvening meetings of all types. Our June General membership meeting was held in person with limited seating, face masks, etc. and I do plan to continue to hold our meetings in this same format until the all clear has been given by the CDC or a vaccine has been made readily available to all Americans. I am also working with our Fund to set up Coronavirus testing in lieu of our annual wellness event. This testing will be implemented as soon as possible based on availability of our service provider and testing supplies. All participants will be notified once final arrangements have been made. Although we are all beyond exhausted with the continued disruption of COVID-19, it is of real concern and we should keep in our thoughts, all those that we have lost or those who are currently battling the illness.

This year, Iowa's legislative session was unique based on its extraordinary pause due to COVID-19, beginning in mid-March with legislators returning 11 weeks later on June 3. Of the legislation that was considered this session, there are some important bills to note:

SF 2338 COVID-19 liability; this bill, one of the significant issues the parties clashed over in the final days of session was supported by the republican majority. The bill disregards protections for workers in an environment affected by COVID-19 by prioritizing immunity for employers. It provides protections from liability lawsuits and it is retroactive to cover the entire period of the presence of the coronavirus in Iowa.

HF 2486 became very heated as the Senate added language restricting the Secretary of State's ability to send out absentee ballot request forms, contrary to what was done for the June 2020 primary. After passing this on a party line vote, the House Dems were successful in arguing the issue and eventually, the House amended the bill to remove the voter suppression language. But, during midnight debate, Senate amended HF 2643, Omnibus Appropriations, restricting auditors from using election databases to fill in missing or incomplete information related to absentee ballots, another form of suppression.

One of the Governors priorities, HF 2627 Professional Licensing Qualifications addressed several provisions for granting and renewal of professional licenses. It was a policy priority the Governor addressed in her State of the State address. IBEW was in the thick of this fight the entire session and through the session pause. We initially worked to remove the language in Sect. 27 allowing nonresidents with no license from being able to obtain a license with just one year of work experience and no education. It was then transitioned to a 3-year requirement. We were able to maintain a requirement for anyone applying for licensure to take an examination. We also secured a language change that allows the board to consider previous experience but does not require the Board to accept the work experience as education. It was a tough fight right up to session's end but we were able to fend off the most terrible aspects of the legislation.

We were also successful in removing certain provisions of SF 2284 that would have included language <u>not</u> requiring electricians working at regent institutions such as the University of Iowa to be licensed.

There were many bills that failed to pass also. One of the most damning was HF2572/ SF2364 prohibiting design build and other alternative delivery methods in the public sector. One particular section explicitly stated a construction manager at risk does not have to honor the Labor agreements of their subcontractors. Union Busting.

With the close of this session we now turn to the November elections. I cannot emphasize enough the importance of electing people that are in line with our Labor issues. Our priority needs to coordinate with our ability to provide for our families. Wages, Healthcare, Retirement, Education, etc. You would not let someone steal your wallet. So do not vote for people that choose to steal from your family with bad legislative priorities. I am looking forward to a successful 2021 session.

"BICSI TE350 - Technician Class"

Class #671

A BICSI Technician certification class has been scheduled to be conducted August 24th – 29th 2020, 8am – 4pm Monday through Friday, and 8am to noon Saturday at the Des Moines Electrical Apprenticeship Training Center, 10700 Justin Drive, Urbandale, IA. A hands-on and written certification examination will be conducted for each participant.

Prerequisites: A minimum of three years of <u>verifiable</u> telecommunications related field experience is required to register for this class.

Requirements:

- A course fee of \$1500 per participant is required to enroll in this class. The course fee includes the BICSI reference text (ITSMM 7th edition), BICSI student workbook, TE-350 course and BICSI exam fee.
- The course fee must be received at the apprenticeship office no later than July 20th, 2020.
- A minimum of 3 participants is required to conduct the class, with a maximum class size of 8 participants.
